## **About the Play**

The O'Brien family are a third-generation Irish family, living and working in Saint John, New Brunswick. It is 1914, and Hap O'Brien, a conductor for the St. John Street Railway Company, is raising two sons with wife Kate. The family is forced to confront the real-world turmoil of social and labour unrest in Saint John, on the eve of the First World War.

# Message from Playwright, Thomas Hodd



History is usually told by a cast of important public figures. But the O'Briens are no such characters. They are third-generation Irish Saint Johners, and you will not find them in a book, an archive, or a diary. They are an idea - the idea that history can be told through the eyes of those most impacted by the decisions of the powerful few. They are an Everyman family, forced to confront the realworld turmoil of social and labour unrest in Saint John, New Brunswick, on the eve of the First World War. What they offer is a simple message: even the powerless have agency.

## **Playwright's Biography**


Born and raised in Saint John, Thomas Hodd is Professor of English at Université de Moncton, where he teaches drama, creative writing and Canadian literature. His essays and reviews have appeared in The Globe and Mail, Toronto Star, Canadian Art, and the Literary Review of Canada, among others. He is the editor of Will R. Bird's war stories, A Soldier's Place (Nimbus 2018) as well as Mary Melville, the Psychic: A Critical Edition (Borealis 2019). His acting credits include stints with KV Players, St.F.X. University's Theatre Antigonish, and the Saint John Theatre Company; he also served briefly as a theatre critic for The Telegraph Journal. His first play, No Man Is an Island, was produced by the Atlantic Repertory Company in 2019 and again in 2021.

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


#### Jake Martin - Hugh O'Brien

Most recently, Pamela served as the Interim Artistic Producer of Theatre Newfoundland Labrador, leading the organization through a time of significant change. Pamela is the recipient of the inaugural Evans Award (2013 Calgary Critics' Awards) for her contribution to the vibrancy of Calgary's theatre community, the 2019 PGC Bra d'Or Award winner for her support and promotion of Canadian women playwrights, and the 2024 Robert Merritt Legacy Award for outstanding contribution to the professional theatre in Nova Scotia. Pamela hails from St Stephen, NB and is a former Associate Artistic Director of TNB. She is thrilled to be back on stage and again be touring NB in the dead of winter. For Rob.



#### Pasha Ebrahimi - Hap O'Brien

Pasha Ebrahimi is a film and theatre professional with roots in the Maritime provinces. Most recently he played the part of Hamlet in Neptune's diverse production of "Rosencrantz and Guildenstern Are Dead" directed by Jeremy Webb.


#### **Alex Rioux - Apprentice Stage Manager**

An avid and passionate collaborator, his work is fascinated with vulnerability, intimacy, the destruction of persona and the celebration of performance. He is currently an artist-in-residence at The Theatre Centre in Toronto.


#### **Emily Soussana - Lighting / Projection Designer**

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


TNB Theatre School's Senior Musical Theatre students will be taking on the newly released Teen Edition of the Tony Award winning musical, Hadestown!
